**A statement of the function, aims and objectives of the service.**

Brnton House Nursery provides children, between the age of 3 months and 5 years, whose parents require nursery support in order to assist their child/ren's education and fulfil their childcare needs.

The nursery provides full time childcare from 8am – 5.45pm, Monday to Friday, 51 weeks of the year.

Younger children are provided with activities to stimulate their mind and body including language and social skills.

The staff take part in planning, recording, observing and collecting evidence of all children's activities and progress, all of which is shared with parents on request or at parent evenings.

All relevant Policies and Procedures that are requested in the National Care Standards have been developed and are widely available for parents to view.

Each child attending Brnton House Nursery will be treated as special and staff will work in close partnership with parents to furnish each child with a unique nursery experience, which will in turn prepare them ultimately for a smooth transition to primary school.

It is our aim that we work together in the child's best interest to ensure a stimulating and productive nursery experience.

This is achieved by:

- ☆ Fully qualified/team members who are working towards a qualification and are committed to further development training.
- ☆ Regular planning
- ☆ To provide information to parents/carers about progress, development, learning and support available from outside agencies
- ☆ Regular evaluations of progress from Care Commission
- ☆ Regular meetings with parents/carers
- ☆ A commitment to equal opportunities and social inclusion for all
